May and June 1941 were historical months for the GO-DEVIL. The first edition of the publication went to press in May, and since it had no name, editors L. C. Geiler and Fredreka Wilbur announced a contest to name the paper.

In June, the GO-DEVIL appeared for the first time. G. L. Shanks, valuation engineer, won the \$5 award by submitting the name because "a go-devil is definitely associated with pipeline operations, it is descriptive of the mission served by a pipeline magazine, and the name is distinctive and catchy."
