


## Right-of-Way Maintenance





### Monitoring Pressure Gauges

ost pipeline facilities have a variety of pressure gauges which must be monitored frequently to ensure pressures are within appropriate ranges. In the photo, Ron Rosholt checks a gauge on one of the three giant steam boilers at Wasco Station, just a few miles from Bakersfield, California. Water pumped through coils above the brick boilers is heated and converted to steam, which serves two purposes: The steam heats the thick oil helping it flow more freely—and also powers the Wasco turbines which pump the oil down the Bakersfield-Caliola Pipeline. This is Shell Pipe Line's only hot-oil line.


### Hard Hats

September






